First write out each word in pencil. Then trace over each word three times with different-coloured pencils. Trace neatly and you will see a rainbow!


Trace around

Write each word using a pencil. Then trace around the outline with a coloured pencil or pen.



Spelling shapes

Draw a shape for each word and write the word inside.



Spelling flower

Draw a big flower on the page with lots of petals. Write your words on each petal.





Squiggly words

Write out your words two times.
Then write them again using squiggly letters!

Three times

Write out each word three times. In pen, in crayon and in pencil.







Newspaper words

Use an old newspaper. Find the letters that make up your words. Cut out the letters and glue them into your book.

Colourful words

Write each letter of your words using a different-coloured pencil.

Draw and Label

Draw and label your spelling words. You MUST colour your drawings and labels.

Don't forget to add a lot of great detail! Do your very best work!

Blue Vowels!

Write each of your spelling words.

You will need a blue <u>coloured</u> pencil.

Trace over the vowels in each
word with your blue <u>coloured</u> pencil.

Vowels = a e i o u

ABC Order

First write your spelling words in a list. Then write them in ABC order.

For an extra bonus, write your words in reverse ABC order!

Bubble Letters

Write your spelling words in bubble letters. After you write your words in bubble letters, colour your words with a crayon or colored pencil.

Bubble Letters Rock!

Silly Sentences

Write silly sentences
using a spelling word in each
sentence. Please underline your
spelling words! Write neatly!

Example: My dog wears a blue and purple dress when he takes a bath.

Across and Down

Write each of your spelling words across and then down (starting with the first letter).

*Examples-	when	four
	h	0
	6	u
	n	r

Make a word search puzzle using your spelling words.

Air Write,

Write your spelling words in the air using your finger. Have a partner read your words as you write them

OR have a partner air write and your job is to read the words.

Back Writing

Use your finger to spell out each of your spelling words, one letter at a time, on your mom or dad's back.

Then it's YOUR turn to try to FEEL and spell!

Pyramid Writing

"Pyramid write" <u>your</u> spelling words.
You must write neatly!

*Example: home home home

Consonant Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the consonants in your words!

Don't forget to write neatly!

Hidden Words

Draw and <u>colour</u> a picture. Hide your spelling words inside your picture.

Show your picture to someone and see if they can find your hidden words!

Buzzing Bees

Draw and colour an outdoor picture.

Count your spelling words. Draw a
bee for each of your spelling words.

Then write the words inside each of
the "spelling" bees. Write neatly!

scrambled Words

Fold a piece of paper three times lengthwise (making three long rectangular columns).

Write your words in the first column.
Then write them again with the letters all mixed up (scrambled) in the second column.
Put your words aside. Come back later to unscramble your words. Write the unscrambled words in the third column.

Good, Clean Words

Find a countertop or flat surface that can be cleaned easily. Spray a small amount of shaving cream and spread it out. Write your spelling words in the shaving cream and be sure to clean up afterwards!

Choo-Choo Words

Write the entire list end-to-end as one long word (like a train). Use a different colored crayon for each word.

hopmopestopdrop

UPPER and Lower

Write your spelling words two times each.

First, write each word in UPPERCASE letters. Second, write each word in lowercase letters.

*Example- SLIDE slide

Connect the Dots

Write ten of your spelling words in dots.

Then connect the dots by tracing over them with a coloured pencil.

Trace a Shape

Count your spelling words. Draw a shape for each word. Then trace each shape by writing your spelling words around them!



Vowel Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the vowels in your spelling words!

Don't forget to write neatly!
